If you need help reading the survey, click the audio icon to hear it read aloud.



This survey is a chance for you to share what you think about your life at school. You'll be asked questions about how you feel about your learning, how you feel at school, and how things are going for you.

You can skip any questions you are not comfortable answering, and you can stop at any time. The only question you cannot skip is your school and year level.

The survey is confidential, which means no one at your school can see your answers, so please be as honest as you can.
