# GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today is the
Solemnity of the Most Holy Body
and Blood of Christ.

At one time, this day was called Corpus Christi, Latin for "the Body of Christ."



Jesus is with a huge crowd of about 5,000 people! They're all hungry, and the disciples only have five small loaves of bread and two fish. It doesn't seem like nearly enough to feed everyone, right? But Jesus takes the food, says a blessing, breaks it into pieces, and tells the disciples to share it. Everyone eats until they're full, and there are even twelve baskets of leftovers! This amazing story shows us how God can do incredible things with even the smallest gifts. Just like Jesus fed the crowd, He feeds us today with the Eucharist. The Eucharist isn't just bread; it's the real Body and Blood of Jesus!

When we receive Communion at Mass, we're getting strength and grace for our spiritual journey.

As a family try making a simple meal together and talk about:

- Gratitude: What are some ways God provides for our family?
- **Sharing:** How can we share what we have with others, even if it doesn't seem like much?
- Mass: How can we pay better attention during Mass, especially when we receive the Eucharist?
- **Kindness:** How can we show love and kindness to each other?

### 350th Anniversary of Sacred Heart **Apparitions**

This year, we commemorate the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to our patron saint, St Margaret Mary Alacoque. During these sacred encounters Christ revealed His Heart, burning with love for humanity, and His deep desire for that love to be returned. The apparitions began in December 1673 and became a powerful call to deeper devotion, trust, and reparation. In recognition of this profound message, Pope Pius IX extended the Feast of the Sacred Heart to the entire Church in 1856. Today, we continue this tradition by celebrating the feast on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost.

As we mark this special anniversary, may we renew our commitment to the Sacred Heart and open our hearts more fully to Christ's boundless love.

20-22 June Jubilee of Governments

From Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter, Fratelli Tutti, on Fraternity and Social Friendship (2020):

"177. Here I would once more observe that "politics must not be subject to the economy, nor should the economy be subject to the dictates of an efficiency-driven paradigm of technocracy". Although misuse of power, corruption, disregard for law and inefficiency must clearly be rejected, "economics without politics cannot be justified, since this would make it impossible to favour other ways of handling the various aspects of the present crisis". Instead, "what is needed is a politics which is far-sighted and capable of a new, integral and interdisciplinary approach to handling the different aspects of the crisis". In other words, a "healthy politics... capable of reforming and coordinating institutions, promoting best practices and 2 overcoming undue pressure and bureaucratic inertia". We cannot expect economics to do this, nor can we allow economics to take over the real power of the state "

### 23-24 June Jubilee of Seminarians



The Jubilee of Seminarians celebrates the gift of God's call to the priesthood and priestly formation. It is an opportunity for the Church to renew her commitment to form priests after the heart of the Good Shepherd and encourage others to respond generously to Christ's call.

We are reminded of the need for seminarians to be formed to know and love the Word of God, proclaim the Gospel with love and truth (1 Cor. 13:6), and to deepen a love for Jesus in the grace of the Holy Spirit. Aware of the multiple and diverse societies and cultures of our age, they will bring the proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ for the salvation of the world.

It belongs to the Church's mission to "care for the birth, discernment and fostering of vocations, particularly those to the priesthood." (ibid., n.13)

Seminarians are the fruit of the Church's response to the Lord's call to send labourers into his harvest (c.f. Mt 9:8; Lk 10:2).

Together the People of God collaborate in the work of caring for the next generation of priests, by which the Church is fed with the word and grace of God (Lumen Gentium, 1964, n.11)
