I was also known as the cattle king. I gave fighter planes to the army during world war one and donated the building known as Eringa to the Education Department.

Who am I?

Fredrick Dutton Sir Sidney Kidman H. B. Hawke Charles Bagot l was born in 1827 at Cornwell.

I was a significent man for Kapunda because I made the first hydraulic car hoist and the weighbridge.

I suddenly died at the North Kapunda Hotel on 17th March 1904 while playing a game of billards.



I passed away in 1935.

I was born 2nd of April 1812 in Lancashire.

I gave 2500 pounds to the Kapunda Hospital.

I owned Anlaby Station.

I found green rocks, known as copper in Kapunda and was a founder of the Kapunda Mine.

I died 22nd of April 1890 in Washington D.C. at the age of 78.



I was born on April 17 1788 at Nurner House in Ireland.

I arrived in Australia in December 1840 on board the ship known as Birman with my wife and five children. I joined Dutton to start up the Kapunda mine site in 1844.

I later built a home in North Adelaide and named it Nearney house after where I was born. I died in July 1880 at 92 years of age.
