The following presentation showcases Sydney based businesses who actively provide a positive impact on OUR LOCAL ENVIRONMENT:

1. **SEABIN** - We are cleaning up ocean plastics in Sydney harbour while highlighting both sydneyiders consumption habits and uncovering WHO ARE THE LARGEST SYDNEY HARBOUR POLLUTERS (hint: FMCG companies)
2. **Bush to Bowl** - We are an Aboriginal social enterprise focused on educating the wider public about our native bushfoods and Aboriginal culture. We sell a native plants and produce with a focus on edible natives to retailers and the public
3. **Reverse Garbage** - Established in 1975 by a group of teachers and community workers determined to ease pressure on the environment. We wanted to divert industrial discards from landfill and reuse those materials in our classrooms. Now Reverse Garbage is a creative reuse centre open 7 days a week for sustainable shopping. Each year 250 tonnes of commercial and industrial waste from landfill artist is redirected to actors, educators to electricians, collectors to charities, painters to puppeteers, students to sewists, vets to visual merchandisers. It's a treasure trove of things you won't find anywhere else.




Bush to Bowl

Bush to Bowl is a social enterprise aimed at creating a healing space and platform for First Nations people by connecting to Country and their traditional foodways. We practice our culture on a daily basis by giving back to Country, our mob and the wider community.

Bush to Bowl is our way of giving back to Culture and to Country as it gives so much to us on a daily basis. We believe strongly about protecting both these spaces now and in the future.

We aim to create culturally safe working spaces for our Aboriginal community to work, share knowledge and connect whilst developing the economic position of our community in the Bushfood industry.
