In addition to this the Strategic Plan captures the key capabilities associated with thinking, learning and leading in a rapidly changing and complex world.




Figure 1: Catholic Education South Australia, *Towards 2027: Expanding Horizons and Deepening Practices*, (February 2022), Page 3.
