Safety and wellbeing of children

Extra-curricular activities pick up -

Our Extracurricular activities procedure requires Parents to sign and submit the permission to release form which includes the time, days and session that their child will be attending the activity. Educators assemble all the children going to the activity and hand them over to the teacher in charge of the activity, who then brings them back to Gowrie OSHC once the activity is completed.

If you are picking up your child from the extracurricular activity, please let our Educators know as we need to account for all children that have been dropped off to activities. Also, if your child has an activity starting at 3.30pm they are required to come to Gowrie OSHC and get themselves signed in/out before going to activities. This helps us in knowing that the child is at activities and saves us time spent on following up on the missing child. The time between 3.20pm and 3.30pm is during Gowrie OSHC operational hours and it is our duty of care to ensure the safety and wellbeing of your child in that period.

Signing in/out on Kiosk -

We have been noticing some children are being dropped off in the mornings without the parents/guardians signing them in and some children also being picked up without Parents signing them out. This is a great safety concern as we cannot account for children if they have not been signed in our out. This is also a mandatory requirement for claiming the childcare subsidy.

If there is a change to pick up person, please let the service know via text or email. Please do not share your Kiosk pin with anyone.

Fee for Failure to notify of absences:

It is extremely important that we are notified of any afternoon absences for your child BEFORE 3pm. There is a charge of \$5 for non-notification.

Casual bookings:

We are asking families who require a casual booking to contact the program 24 hours prior to the required session via email or phone (0436616744). The program will then confirm if the casual booking can be accommodated. If families do have an emergency, please contact the program as soon as possible. Our intention in requiring 24 hours' notice is to ensure the program can plan for children who may have allergies or medical conditions, to ensure we have the necessary child to educator ratios and to update the collection of children rolls. Casual bookings are dependent on availability and not guaranteed but the Gowrie NSW OSHC team will endeavour to accommodate any emergency bookings. We will continue to review this process and make amendments where possible; we are committed to supporting families as best as we can.

Program Highlights

What's been happening at Gowrie OSHC

One of the most exciting features of our OSHC program has been the opening of 3 new demountable spaces for children. We are very excited that this project of setting up these 3 places that started a year ago has now been accomplished successfully. The whole project was guided through a reflective journey based on the Gowrie NSW environment prescripts and the National Quality Standards 3- Physical Environments. We explored how to ensure each environment provides a diverse range of engaging learning experiences while maintaining a warm, homely environment for children.

The first demountable was designated as a Kindy playroom, this is a playroom based on Gowrie NSW program foundations that highlights our play- based teaching approach that provides an environment that provide a sense of wonder, promote imagination and problem solving. The second demountable is our Mindfulness/quiet Room. with sensory and calming resources.

The third demountable became our year 4 to 6 room for reading, homework, or indoor games like golf, uno, chess, Lego, Caram board, magnetics etc. One of the most thrilling aspects about these new spaces is how involved the children have been in the process of establishing them. Every piece of flat-packed furniture was assembled with their help, and the layout of all rooms was designed in consultation with a committee of children who volunteered.

The children have demonstrated their appreciation of the new spaces by spending more time in the demountable than any other play area available to them. Below are some photos of the newly created environments.

Cooking club on Monday's the last few weeks included cakes, cookies, and muffins! Seniors have been creating Honey Joys and other cold snacks to share with everyone on Wednesday afternoons! Everyone looks forward to what has been made every afternoon!

Mindfulness club: Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday

The Mindfulness club and our sensory space has acquired new resources to help with children's sensory needs and stimulation. There is an addition of two new goldfish in the room which has surprised everyone! The children love caring for them and watching them swim about in the mindfulness room as they relax and take part in the mindfulness program. There are numerous suggestions for names for the fish!! We must soon decide on their names!

Along with the new aquarium we have another fish tank that has artificial fluorescent fish which are mesmerizing and the tank lights up and shifts between various colours. The visual effects and the stimulation these Fish Tanks provide helps children to calm down and relax. We also purchased a Comfy Hugging Peapod and two sensory cushion that provide soothing deep pressure and offer a comforting caressing hug, enabling a calming sense of security to children.







Gardening club- Tuesday (Junior) and Wednesday (Senior)

A committed group of youngsters diligently tend to the garden each week, showcasing their passion and commitment to nurturing nature. Children have cleared away rubbish revived plant life, and watered plants, breathing new life into our beloved garden. There have been new bird houses artistically designed and hung by children.




